ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Matson is proud to introduce to Guam a new environmental and community relations program, Adahi I Tano'. As a company serving some of the most pristine environments in the world, Matson has taken a leadership role in promoting "green" initiatives in our business and community service activities. This new program will encourage non-profit organizations on Guam to organize cleanup efforts that will benefit our environment, while concurrently raising money for good causes. Matson looks forward to working with the local community to help preserve our environment and raise money for well deserving organizations.



Through this program, Matson will make a \$500 cash contribution to non-profit organizations that successfully complete a cleanup initiative. In addition, Matson will donate the use of container equipment on Guam for environmental cleanup projects arranged by non-profit organizations. Matson will pay for the trucking expenses incurred in the delivery and pickup of the containers.

HOW IT WORKS

- The non-profit organization completes and submits an application form along with required documentation.
- The application is reviewed by Matson's Adahi I Tano' committee who notifies the non-profit organization if they qualify for the program.
- Matson advises cleanup location, confirms project date with the applicant and schedules the delivery and pick-up of the Adahi I Tano' container.
- Matson delivers the container to the cleanup site.
- Group performs cleanup (with a minimum of 10 volunteers for a minimum of 4 hours), putting their garbage bags into the container. Recyclable trash is separated into clear garbage bags.
- Matson picks up container and delivers it to the disposal facility.
- Group submits before and after photos to Matson.
- Matson schedules check presentation to non-profit organization.

HOW TO APPLY

It is our hope that this program will encourage and facilitate more non-profit groups to organize cleanup efforts throughout the island. It is in all of our interests to make every effort to preserve Guam's natural beauty, not only for those who live here, but also for those who travel from all over the world to marvel at the islands' unique and spectacular environment.
